PERFORMER BIOGRAPHIES

SEAN DORSEY (Artistic Director + Dancer - he/him) is a San Francisco-based choreographer, dancer, writer, educator and activist. Long recognized as the U.S.' first acclaimed transgender modern dance choreographer, Dorsey has toured his work to more than 30 cities across the US and internationally – and has taught with his explicitly trans-positive pedagogy in more than 35 cities.

Dorsey has been awarded an Emmy Award, and is a Doris Duke Artist and a Dance/USA Artist Fellow. He has been awarded five Isadora Duncan Dance Awards and the Goldie Award for Performance. In 2019, he became the first openly-transgender person on the cover of Dance Magazine.

Dorsey has been awarded commissions from American Dance Festival, Bates Dance Festival, Dance Place (Washington DC), Highways Performance Space (Los Angeles), Links Hall (Chicago), Maui Arts & Cultural Center (Maui), Queer Cultural Center (San Francisco), 7 Stages (Atlanta), The Theater Offensive (Boston), and Velocity Dance Center (Seattle).

Dorsey, director Lindsay Gauthier and the KQED Producer team were recently awarded an Emmy Award for the short film "Sean Dorsey Dance: Dreaming Trans & Queer Futures" – the film is currently screening at film festivals around the world.

Dorsey is the founder and Artistic Director of Fresh Meat Productions – now celebrating its 22nd Season, Fresh Meat Productions invests in the creative expression and cultural leadership of trans and gender-nonconforming communities through its year-round programs including the annual FRESH MEAT FESTIVAL.

BRANDON GRAHAM (he/they) was born in Rochester NY and trained at School Of The Arts and Odasz Dance Theatre under Jessica Odasz. He since has graduated from Alonzo King Lines BFA program. He has had the opportunity to work with Flock Works, Robert Moses, Kara Davis, Christian Burns and Gregory Dawson. After graduating the BFA program in 2020 he has been doing freelance work with Kristin Damrow, David Herrera Performance Company, Peninsula Ballet Theatre, Alyssa Mitchel and more. This is Brandon's second season with Sean Dorsey Dance.

HÉCTOR JAIME (they/she/he) was born and raised in Mexicali, Baja California, México. They began their training with Manuel Torres in El Centro Estatal de las Artes (CEART). Héctor graduated from the Alonzo King's Lines Ballet BFA Program in San Francisco affiliated with Dominican University of California. Post graduation, they had the opportunity to be a member of Sean Dorsey Dance, Dawson Dance SF, and Detour Dance Company. Héctor started their own company "Xochipilli Dance Company based in the Bay Area. XDC has now premiered work in different residencies since its foundation including Deborah Slater Dance Theater summer residency in studio 210, Festival of Latin American Contemporary Choreographers (FLACC), BBQueer Dance Festival, PUSH Artist in residency, D.I.R.T 2023, Stapleton School of the Performing Arts Choreographic Residency and Queering Dance Festival. This is Héctor's third season with Sean Dorsey Dance.

DAVID LE (he/they) was born and raised in San Jose, CA. As a first-generation student with influences of cultural and street styles of dance, David earned his BFA from San Jose State University (SJSU). At SJSU, Le danced with the University Dance Theater and had the pleasure to work with Doug Varone, Kyle Abraham, Mike Esperanza and more. He embraces the collaboration of different communities, and participates in events with Decipher and Archive Dance Companies. In addition to dance, David is a neuromuscular therapist and has a deaf dog named Wilbur. David is excited for his second season with Sean Dorsey Dance!

NOL SIMONSE (he/him) grew up in Washington, D.C., and trained at the Boston Conservatory of Music. He moved to San Francisco in 1997 and is a founding member of Kunst-Stoff, (artistic directors Tomi Paasonen and Yannis Adoniou). Nol has worked with Janice Garrett since the inception of her company, Janice Garrett and Dancers, and continued with her and her partner, Charles Moulton, when they formed Garrett+Moulton Productions. He has danced with Sean Dorsey Dance since 2007. He is also a longtime collaborator/performer of Sue Roginski, Eric Kupers, Christy Funsch, Stephen Pelton, and Kara Davis. Nol was awarded an Isadora Duncan Bay Area Dance Award in 2011, and in 2009 Nol received a GOLDIE for dance (Guardian Outstanding Local Discovery). Nol was the first person to win Luna Dance Institute's Choreofund prize, and Dance Teacher Magazine published an interview with him in the September, 2016 issue. Nol currently teaches modern at the Alonzo King's Lines Dance Center, and Shawl-Anderson Dance Center. He has taught choreography, repertory, and performance workshops for adults and teens, and has made dances for Diablo Ballet, the Lines summer program, students at USF, Shawl-Anderson Youth Ensemble, ODC's Dance Jam, and Dance Mission Theater's Grrrl Brigade. Nol produced eight seasons of 'Shared Space' with Todd Eckert at Dance Mission Theater from 2007-2016 and has had residencies at Dance Mission and Studio 210. Nol was one of the 25 nominated artists to create a dance for the 25th anniversary season of the West Wave Dance Festival, and was a mentee of Margaret Jenkins in 2017 for her CHIME Program. This is Nol's 16th season with Sean Dorsey Dance.

COMPOSER/VOCALIST BIOGRAPHIES

JESSE OLSEN BAY (he/they) is a musician, composer, teacher, and activist. His work dwells in the intersection of sound, song, embodiment, and community organizing. He directs and performs with MINERS, an ensemble dedicated to using traditional American folk music as a springboard for embodied sonic experimentation. Jesse has received awards and support from American Composers Forum, San Francisco Friends of Chamber Music, Ucross Foundation, and the Isadora Duncan Awards, among others. ANOMIE BELLE (they/them) is a composer, producer, songwriter and multi-instrumentalist who grew up in Portland and resides in Seattle. Anomie is a producer, classical violinist and vocalist, and they perform, loop and manipulate strings, keyboards, vocals, samplers, drum machines, guitar and bass to create cinematic,

layered compositions and songs. Their lyrics take a queer, sociological lens to deconstructing power, systems and culture. Anomie and Sean have been working together for many years, and their collaborative relationship has continued to grow as they collaborated to create custom compositions for The Lost Art of Dreaming.

DR. ALEX KELLY (he/him) is a cellist, composer, and professor. He composes and performs with major symphony orchestras, chamber orchestras, new music ensembles, string quartets, cello quartets, big bands, jazz combos, rock bands, hip-hop crews, klezmer bands, world music ensembles, theater companies, radio productions, ballet companies, modern dance companies, and circus troupes. Dance companies he has worked with include LINES ballet, Margaret Jenkins, Lizz Roman, Beth Fein, Axis Dance Company, Les 7 Doigts de le Main, and since 2008, Sean Dorsey. Alex was part of the composing team that won a 2016 Isadora Duncan Dance Award for outstanding achievement in Music/Sound/Text for the original soundscore for THE MISSING GENERATION. **www.alexkelly.com**

BEN KESSLER (he/him) is a music educator, composer, arranger, mixing engineer, sound designer, and multi-instrumentalist from Saline, Michigan. He has performed with numerous groups, and collaborated with Sean Dorsey since 2005. In addition to composing and working in his studio, Ben currently teaches private music lessons, runs a klezmer group for 3rd to 5th graders, and is the musical director and lead trombonist of both a jazz septet and a 19-piece big band.

KELSEY LU (they/them) is London-based singer, songwriter, cellist, and producer who constructs their dreamy, off-balance alternative music with a mix of classical chamber, folk, and electronic components, topping off intricate arrangements with soulful vocals. They released their first EP, the spare 'Church' in 2016 before expanding their palette with layered electronics and instruments including strings, guitars, and multi-tracked vocals. Their studio debut, Blood, landed in 2019.
